Girl is a registered Girl Scout Junior for the year the project is planned, implemented and completed.

Girl is NOT a registered Girl Scout Junior for the duration of the specified timeframe.

Girl has completed one Girl Scout Junior Journey and understands & demonstrates the leadership qualities outlined in the Journey.

Girl has NOT completed one Girl Scout Junior Journey, or has completed one but is unable to demonstrate the leadership qualities.

Bronze Award Project is completed by a team of girls.

Girl completes Bronze Award Project on her own.

Bronze Award Project is considered a Take Action Project (has potential for sustainability and is working with an organization - not for an organization).

Bronze Award Project is a collection (such as food drive, pet food drive, clothing drive) or "canned" project with no potential for sustainability.

Final Report is completely & accurately filled out, including girl's names and grades & answers to all questions.

 Final Report is incomplete, not on the proper form, and/or does not describe in detail the full aspect of the project.

Project title has correct spelling and is related to the project topic.

No title provided and/or does not relate to the project topic.

Girls have put in an appropriate amount of hours into Bronze Award Project (GSUSA suggests a minimum of 20 hours per girl).

Girls have put in less than 15 hours into their Bronze Award Project.

Leader has read through, approved, and signed off on Final Report.

Leader signature is missing or questions have not been checked for accuracy.
